1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Paul Van Konynenburg called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm.

A. 7th Street Bridge/North County Corridor (NCC) Update

Dave Leamon gave a presentation on the North County Corridor (NCC). He stated that the project was under construction and was expected to be completed in the fall of 2027. A. Measure L Regional Control Project Cooperative Agreement with Stanislaus County for Faith Home Road Expressway Project

José Luis Cáceres discussed the Measure L Regional Control Project Cooperative Agreement with Stanislaus County for Faith Home Road Expressway Project. He stated that the county would be requesting \$8M of the available \$10M.

There were several questions asked by the committee to which both Mr. Leamon and Mr. Cáceres were able to provide information.

B. Support for the Application to the StanCOG FFY 2027-2030 Funding Round for SR 132 West Projects

José Luis Cáceres discussed the support for the application to the StanCOG FFY 2027-2030 Funding Round for SR 132 West projects. Mr. Cáceres stated that there was a call for projects to apply for \$90M and that StanCOG would be eligible to apply and would be applying for three large applications.

The committee had several questions to which Mr. Cáceres provided an answer.

C. State Route 132 (SR 132) West Update

Tony Harris discussed the State Route 132 (SR 132) West project. Mr. Harris stated that the environmental documents were done, and they were currently in the final design, permitting, and right-of-way acquisition. Mr. Harris also stated that they would be hosting an open house on October 2nd.

Chair Paul Van Konynenburg asked several questions, and Mr. Harris provided answers.

Member Craig Lewis asked when the project would be made into four lanes, and Mr. Harris provided an answer.

Recommendation

Background

The Measure L Ordinance provides for the implementation of the Expenditure Plan, as approved and adopted by the Local Transportation Authority (StanCOG), which provides funding for countywide local street and road improvements, arterial street widening, signalization, pedestrian, bicyclist, and driver safety improvements, as well as sixteen regional projects. These needed improvements are funded by Measure L, the one-half of one cent retail transactions and use tax established for a twenty-five-year period, April 1, 2017 – March 31, 2042. The revenues are deposited in a special fund, used solely for the transportation projects, improvements and programs described in the Expenditure Plan which is considered a part of the Ordinance passed by Voters in November 2016.

In 2017, the StanCOG Policy Board adopted the Measure L Policies and Procedures: Local Control Funds and the Measure L Policies and Procedures: Regional Control Projects, to implement rules and administrative procedures to carry out its responsibilities in administering Measure L Funds.

Discussion

The StanCOG Measure L Oversight Committee and Citizens Advisory Committee suggested that StanCOG build upon the positive work the Measure has been doing in the county and suggested additional public outreach efforts. StanCOG, through consultation with its member agencies and the Policy Board, created the parameters for a more coordinated and formal approach to provide meaningful information to the public in an easy-to-understand format.

In September 2023, StanCOG issued a formal Request for Proposals to implement a countywide public awareness/educational campaign to increase the knowledge and understanding of the Measure L sales tax revenues and projects (local and regional) funded with this local sales tax measure.

The campaign includes, but is not be limited to, items such as the creation of an overarching Measure L brand message to be used countywide, development and maintenance of a media presence (including traditional news outlets and social media), website development, coordination, and maintenance (including assisting the StanCOG member agencies with the minimum website requirements), identifying project-level milestones, making presentations to civic and community groups, city council and board of supervisors meetings, and conducting groundbreaking/ribbon cutting ceremonies.

At its February 21, 2024 meeting, the StanCOG Policy Board approved funding the campaign with Measure L revenues in an amount not to exceed one percent (1%) of the annual Measure L revenue. This annual allocation is in addition to the allocation for Administrative Expenses authorized by the Ordinance. Consistent with the Ordinance and state statute, in no event will an amount exceeding one percent (1%) of the annual revenue go towards paying the administrative salaries and benefits of StanCOG staff.

The allocation of Measure L revenues and permitted uses are identified in the Measure L Ordinance, Expenditure Plan, Local Control Policies and Procedures and the Regional Project Policies and Procedures. Permitted uses in the Ordinance include the administration of the Expenditure Plan, construction, acquisition, maintenance, and operation of streets, roads, highways, including state highways and public transit systems for related transportation purposes, project management and oversight of projects, expenditures for planning, environmental review, engineering and design, related right-of-way acquisition, and debt service on bonds. Administration of the sales tax includes ongoing communication with the public about how the tax dollars are being spent. This public outreach provides clear and accessible information on the benefits of Measure L and the projects it funds and furthers transparency with the public about how funds are spent. Leveraging sales tax revenue through grant writing is a common strategy for administering local expenditure plans. By pursuing grants that align with and further the voter-approved expenditure plan, local funds can be augmented with state and federal grants to maximize what can be accomplished under the Expenditure Plan.

Background

The Measure L Ordinance provides for the implementation of the Expenditure Plan, as approved and adopted by the Local Transportation Authority (StanCOG), which provides funding for countywide local street and road improvements, arterial street widening, signalization, pedestrian, bicyclist, and driver safety improvements, as well as sixteen regional projects. These needed improvements are funded by Measure L, the one-half of one cent retail transactions and use tax established for a twenty-five-year period, April 1, 2017 – March 31, 2042. The revenues are deposited in a special fund, used solely for the transportation projects, improvements and programs described in the Expenditure Plan which is considered a part of the Ordinance passed by Voters in November 2016.

The Ordinance requires StanCOG to conduct an annual independent audit to assure that the revenues expended are necessary and reasonable in carrying out the purposes of the Ordinance. StanCOG and the ten (10) Member Agencies, the Stanislaus Regional Transit Authority (StanRTA), and the MOVE, the Consolidated Transportation Services Agency (CTSA), are audited each year using the criteria outlined in the Measure L Ordinance and for compliance with StanCOG's Measure L Policies and Procedure.

Background

The Measure L revenue projection per the expenditure plan is \$38,000,000, annually. Measure L funds are received monthly from the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA). Monthly estimated allocations are made by CDTFA using methodologies to estimate sales tax revenues based on past reports for the region. The actual amount for sales tax revenue is calculated in the month following the end of each quarter, at which time CDTFA will deduct their administrative fees for the quarter and issue a final quarterly payment for the net amount based on the actual quarterly revenue received. Distributions made to jurisdictions for FY 2025/26 are based on receipts from August 1, 2025- July 31, 2026.

Discussion

As of September 30, 2025, StanCOG has received \$5,052,588.75 in Measure L receipts for FY 2025/26. The attached schedules show the status of the Measure L receipts as of September 2025. Attachment 1 provides the total monthly allocation to date as compared to the total estimated for the Fiscal Year. The year-over-year comparison between FY 2024/25 and FY 2025/26 reflects an increase of Measure L revenue of \$186,948.92.

Attachment 2 reports the allocation of Measure L funds by category and jurisdiction. Attachment 3 identifies the total breakdown by jurisdiction and/or project.
